The Second Window: How a Focus on Freshmen Transformed a System

- This documentary spotlights the research that inspired Chicago Public Schools to shift their energy and focus to ninth grade — once considered a "throw away year" — and catalyzed sustained, systemwide improvement. This shift transformed Chicago from the "worst district in the nation" to one that is now leading the nation in keeping freshmen on-track toward high school graduation and postsecondary success.
